**Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11**

**A reading from the prophet Isaiah**

‘Console my people, console them’  
says your God.  
‘Speak to the heart of Jerusalem  
and call to her  
that her time of service is ended,  
that her sin is atoned for,  
that she has received from the hand of the Lord  
double punishment for all her crimes.’

A voice cries, ‘Prepare in the wilderness  
a way for the Lord.  
Make a straight highway for our God  
across the desert.  
Let every valley be filled in,  
every mountain and hill be laid low.  
Let every cliff become a plain,  
and the ridges a valley;  
then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed  
and all mankind shall see it;  
for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.’

Go up on a high mountain,  
joyful messenger to Zion.  
Shout with a loud voice,  
joyful messenger to Jerusalem.  
Shout without fear,

**2 Peter 3:8-14**

**A reading from the second letter of St Peter**

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never  
forget: that with the Lord, ‘a day’ can mean a  
thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day.  
The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises,  
as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being  
patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and  
everybody to be brought to change his ways. The  
Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with

a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark
