

HANDY PERSON: St Paul's Hall gets great usage and we're aiming to do the same with the newly renovated hall at Holy Spirit. We could do with some 'named people' who can be called on by our clients in the event of a problem occurring (e.g. lack of heat, no water, electrical failure etc.) You may not be able to fix the problem, but we can furnish you with a list of professionals we use whom you can call on. Fr Simon is often out of the presbytery during the day so isn't much help in an immediate situation and besides, he can barely tie his own shoelaces.

URGENT APPEAL FOR MOUNT ST JOSEPH'S CARE HOME: The Little Sisters of the Poor have had to take the heartbreaking decision to close their Leeds Care Home after RAAC concrete was found in 95% of the roof. Over the next few months all 62 residents must be re-homed and over 90 staff face redundancy. The Sisters must meet costs upwards of \pounds 500,000 to keep everyone safe until all residents have been found new homes. More details here: https://www.dioceseofleeds.org.uk/urgent-appeal/. FROM YOUR PASTOR

As I type this, I've just come in from burning the first load of palms that you started to bring back last weekend. So far, I've enough ash for Ash Wednesday and every Wednesday for the next year, so expect a very liberal dusting next week! Please keep bringing your old palms in and if any come in after this weekend, I'll use them in the Easter fire. It makes me feel all 'sustainable' and something like a 'recycling god', even though I nearly choked on the smoke. I'm not quite sure what the neighbours think, either!

It seemed ironic that as I burnt the old palms, a box of new palms for Palm Sunday was delivered and then it seemed a bit strange that having blessed something for spiritual use I was now burning it within the year. But there's great theology in this action. Firstly, it reminds us that the liturgical year, like our own lives, goes in cycles: there's a time for something new and there's a time for letting go in order that we might make way for the new again. Our lives (and the seasons of the year) are like that: letting things go so that they can be consumed by the years and age, but fully expecting that something new will rise from the ashes of our lives. Secondly, it's a reminder that nothing is so blessed and sacred in this world that it is immovable and permanent. All must give way to God's plan, whatever that is, and that includes, the earth, the sun, the moon and our very lives, of course. It strikes me that within the noble ethics of caring for the earth there is an element of fear at the passing of things and a (deranged) idea that if we all try hard enough, the world will exist forever. It won't; our Faith doesn't teach that. Sure, we mustn't abuse the gift of the earth which has been entrusted to us, but neither must we make an idol of it. There has to be a balance. As The Byrds sang back in the day, paraphrasing the wisdom of the ancients, "To everything...there is a season (turn, turn, turn) and a time for everything under heaven.(turn, turn, turn)"

This week we turn again to the season of Lent and we mark ourselves with an outward symbol of the 'dusty' nature that is truly ours. The missal prayers remind us that for the faithful Christian this shouldn't be a gloomy season but a time of joy at the thought of the endless renewal of life that is afforded us by our great and gracious God. Let us not waste this sacred time.
